CADOGAN CAFÉ DESIGN COMPETITION EXHIBITION TO OPEN ON 26TH NOVEMBER

Creating a Chelsea Original: the new Cadogan Café

The six shortlisted schemes for the Cadogan Café design competition organised by Malcolm Reading Consultants, on behalf of the Cadogan Estate, will be displayed at a public exhibition held over three days on November 26th, 27th and November 29th 2012.

The images and models of the proposed concept designs will be on show at the Saatchi Gallery in London.

The design competition for the £2 million project to redevelop the existing café, positioned in a key part of Duke of York Square in Chelsea, was launched in July. It attracted 147 expressions of interest and the shortlisted teams include:

A skilful blend of retail, residential, cultural and commercial uses, it integrates several notable listed buildings, including the former Royal Military Asylum, designed by John Sanders (1768-1826), now reinvented as the Saatchi Gallery.
